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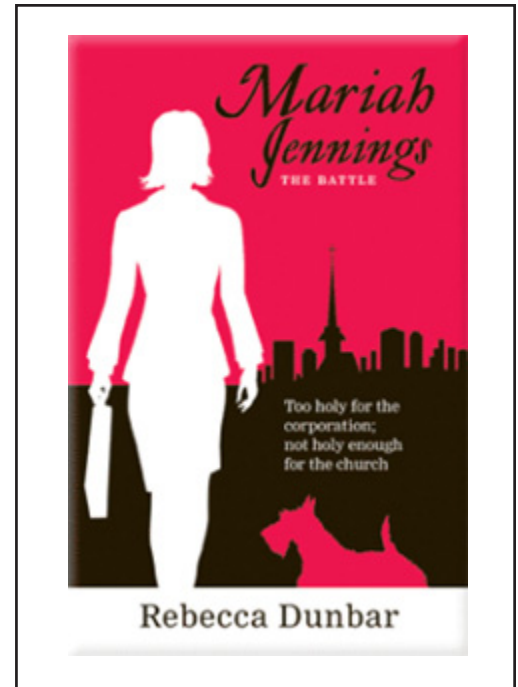
“Too holy for the corporation; not holy enough for the church”
